Requests for Holidays / Exceptional Circumstances Form

Please note that the school is unable to authorise holidays for any child unless there are exceptional circumstances. In the first instance you are asked to discuss your request for any leave of absence with myself. It is really important to ensure your child attends school. There is clear evidence to show that non-attendance has a detrimental effect on the progress and achievement of potential for a child. Whilst there are always legitimate and understandable reasons for absence, the National average attendance per pupil is currently 96% for an academic year. St Hugh's is proud that its attendance figure is always above the National average. Anything below 90% is a cause for concern and may require the involvement of the school's Education Welfare Officer to verify and support the maximum attendance possible. Thank you for your understanding.
