OVERVIEW INTRODUCTION



Space is a really exciting concept for children. If at all possible, introduce it to coincide with a current space mission – you could then show the children a 'news item' either from a newspaper or TV.

Print off and display this image (see page 7), show it on a whiteboard, or project other images of the moon, stars and planets for children to see. Use the images to stimulate discussion. Talk with children about day and night and encourage parents to go out with their child in the evening to look at the moon and stars in the night sky. Talk about space and how astronauts travelled to the moon in a space rocket. Introduce some of the names of the planets, particularly Mars, and talk about the characteristics of the moon.



But it's breakfast time!
























I will take with me:				









Ingredients

- 4 cups of play sand
- 2 cups of cornflour
- 3/4 cup of water
- 2 tbsp coloured powder paint
- a huge sprinkling of eco-glitter

Method

- 1. Mix the sand and cornflour in a large bowl until combined.
- **2.** Tip the water in gradually, mixing it in as you go. By the end it should be well-combined with a consistency like a crumbly pastry mix.
- **3.** Form it into a ball. If it does not hold together, then add a tiny bit more water. It should not be wet, but should feel slightly damp.
- **4.** Stir through the powder paint using a colour of your choice and add the eco-glitter. You will need to use your fingers to thoroughly mix in the powder paint and eco-glitter.

You could try replacing the water with baby oil for a different texture.
