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## OVERVIEW INTRODUCTION



Display the image above. Children who live in a city will be used to its relentless, busy pace, but those living in more rural settings may not have experienced the sounds and sights of a city coming to life at night, with its noise, bustle, and dazzling lights.

Talk with your family and ask if anyone has visited this city and seen these famous landmarks.





### Ingredients

- Clean sand natural or coloured
- Waterproofing spray, e.g. Scotchgard

### **Method**

- 1. Spread the sand out on a baking tray lined with foil.
- **2.** Spray with the waterproofing spray in a well-ventilated space, and repeat three times, stirring well between each spray.
- 3. Allow the sand to dry for two hours before use.







### **Ingredients**

- 3/4 cup of cold water
- 1 cup of PVA glue (Elmers liquid school glue is best)
- liquid food colouring
- 1/2 cup of hot water
- 1 tspn borax

You will need a bowl and a jug.

### **Method**

- 1. Mix the cold water, glue and food colouring in a bowl.
- **2.** Mix the hot water and borax in a jug, stirring until the borax has completely dissolved.
- **3.** Slowly add the water, glue and food colouring mixture to the hot water and borax mixture and mix well.
- 4. Pour off the excess water.

Your flubber is now ready to use! Store it in a sealed plastic tub.
