Classify the dance band instruments playing In the mood

Hey, Mr Miller

Learn a song and use actions to demonstrate its structure

Hey, Mr Miller ~ round

Sing Hey, Mr Miller as a three-part round

Keeping the movements of the Mr Miller instrument mimes rhythmical will help the three groups visually as they sing the song as a round. They will be able to more readily see and feel the same beat if movements are simple and this will help them to keep their singing in time. A confident conductor will also help to indicate the beat of the song.
